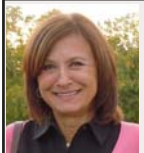

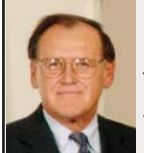

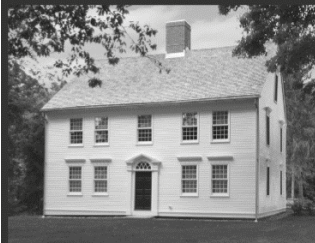

2012 CHANGES TO HEALTH, SAFETY, and WELFARE EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

A new health, safety, and welfare (HSW) education requirement will go into effect in January 2012 for members as was voted by the AIA Board of Directors on December 9th. AIA members, starting with 2012, will be required to complete 12 hours of HSW education. This is an increase from the previous requirement of 8 HSW. AIA members are still required to fulfill 18 hours in total of continuing education hours during the calendar year, which now includes 12 hours of HSW and the same 4 hours of sustainable design hours. The AIA Board will re-evaluate the sustainable design (SD) requirement in 2012.

After reviewing the state licensing requirements across the country, AIA believes that increasing the HSW requirement provides AIA members with the following:

- Sets a higher standard for AIA members
- Enables AIA members to fulfill state licensing requirements for most states
- Raises the level and quality of our continuing education and professional development of architects.

Additionally, in the calendar year 2012, aligning closer with state licensing boards' practice, AIA members will no longer be able to self-report HSW courses for credit. Members will need to complete HSW credits by taking qualifying courses from registered AIA CES Providers and Providers will need to report HSW courses for members to receive HSW credits. Members may continue to self-report learning unit (LU) credit hours for non-provider courses and programs.

In the past, AIA members were able to attend courses outside of the AIA CES Provider network and submit a self-report online to be reviewed for HSW or SD credit. AIA CES is implementing this new HSW and SD credit policy to ensure quality education and establish an educational standard for the courses that AIA members attend.

AIA members have access to a transcript service recognized by many state licensing boards as proof of attendance of continuing education activities. The transcript includes name of the course, course number, link to a course description, provider, date of course, number of credits, and types of credits. If you are interested in becoming a member, and gain access to the transcript service, please contact AIA Membership at 800-242-3837 option 2.

AIA Eastern New York provides assistance to AIA members needing continuing education credits not reported to their transcript by contacting the original provider and having those credits reported. If your transcript does not have all the continuing education credits reported, please contact Jillian Merriam, Executive Assistant for assistance.

AIA members who have not completed the required number of continuing education credits in a given year, will become lapsed and be placed on the CES Audit list. If the requirement is not fulfilled by the end of the following year, AIA members will be unable to renew. Please check your transcript by logging onto your account at www.aia.org and selecting the continuing education tab. CES Discovery is user friendly and allows AIA members to review their transcripts, check the calendar for upcoming events and even sign up for virtual programs!

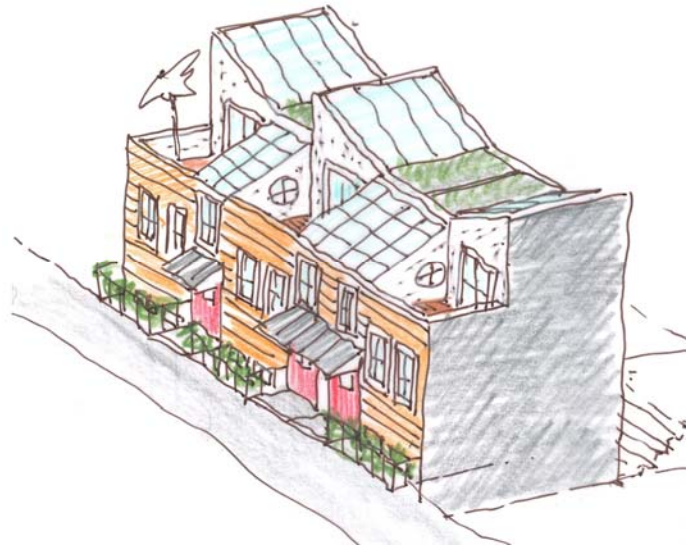

Vision Accomplished - Design Competition - Conover Cottages - First prize



A Redhook/ Brooklyn based realtor and developer/ builder - in appreciation of the historic buildings and neighborhood - announced an open RFP/ competition on the AIA website for three fishermen rowhouses (Conover Cottages) that they intend to develop and sell.



The (3) Conover Cottages are located at Conover Street, A residential and industrial urban block near container port and prospect park, Brooklyn, NY. Historically built as fishermen cottages with exterior ½ stair down to garden level and ½ exterior stair up to first floor, and roof 1 ½ stories above the street level.

Reference to vernacular historic buildings using their architectural language (double hung windows and horizontal siding) and “genius loci”, sloped white roofs suggesting sails out on the water, helped develop the three dimensional shape. Buildings can be mirrored or in a row for variation and best solar exposure.

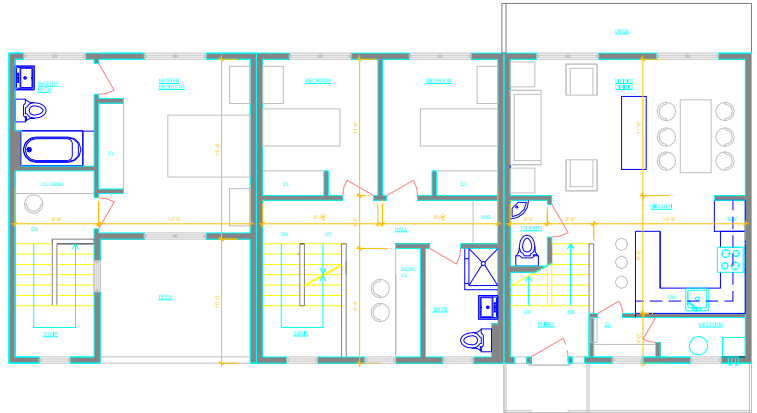

It seemed like an architect's dream to develop a vision for an interesting residential / industrial urban block with a client that cares for architecture. It reminded me of the many design competitions I had done for numerous urban sites in Berlin.

It was easy and fun to accommodate the requested program of a townhouse. The lower garden level includes the kitchen, living room, dining room, half bath and mechanical room. The first floor includes two bedrooms, a bathroom and W/D. Finally, the upper floor level includes a master bedroom, master bathroom and deck. For a more efficient and spacially connection circulation system, the stoop and exterior basement entry on the lower garden level were given up.



The buildings have a highly insulated tight building envelope for reduction of heating and cooling costs. The solar panels on the sloped roof are a source of renewable hot water. The cement board siding and EIFS at roof level as exterior finishes provide shading and protection of entry, back porch and with shed roofs. Proposed terracing of backyard for planting and access.
